Join Us For Old-Fashioned City Celebration At New Location ~ Ernie Howlett Park!

The City of Rolling Hills Estates is pleased to commemorate its 59th anniversary at the annual old-fashioned City Celebration on Saturday, September 17, 2016 from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. at its **NEW venue: Ernie Howlett Park, 25851 Hawthorne Boulevard.**

Residents, friends, family, and neighbors are invited to join the day-long festivities, which will feature a variety of mobile food vendors, beer garden, poker ride, equestrian events, pony rides, petting zoo, and an assortment of fun games and activities, such as the water balloon toss, watermelon-eating contests, and the hay jumping and corn kernel pits. On stage will be a variety of entertainment including a magician, wild animal shows, and a talent showcase of youth from local dance, theatre, music, and martial arts studios.



Numerous equestrian arena activities will be held throughout the entire day, including fun horsemanship events, a therapeutic horseshoeing demonstration, a parade of breeds, a PV Junior Drill Team performance, a dressage demonstration, emergency animal response preparedness informational booth, an Orange County Vaulting Team performance, a Western Reining Horse Demonstration, and a presentation of the Interscholastic Equestrian Teams from Palos Verdes and Peninsula High Schools.

At only \$10 per hand, card-playing carriage drivers and horseback riders may want to try their luck in the 25th Annual Poker Ride. Non-riders who wish to participate can purchase tickets and have a riding friend carry them. Players may register at Chandler Park for the one-hour ride anytime from 8:00 am to 10:00 am. Kick Off The Ho! Ho! Holidays With Annual Parade Of Lights

In anticipation of the upcoming holiday season, the City of Rolling Hills Estates is pleased to announce that plans are already underway for the 18th Annual Peninsula Holiday Parade of Lights, which will be held on Saturday, December 3, 2016.



The parade will take place from 6:00 pm to 7:30 pm, as illuminated floats and festive participants make their way through Peninsula Center along Silver Spur Road, Roxcove Drive, Deep Valley Drive, and finally, through The Promenade on the Peninsula mall.

To showcase the unique character of the Palos Verdes Peninsula, the City encourages community and civic groups, school and youth organizations, marching bands, drill teams, equestrian units, local businesses, and others to participate in the parade. Applications are due by November 15th. There is no entry fee.

Awards will be given in three categories: Musical Sweepstakes, Best Commercial Float, and the Mayor's Trophy for the best local entry. Judging will be provided by the Southern California School Band and Orchestra Association.

Local businesses and community organizations interested in creative methods of promotion may want to sponsor of a parade unit, or, better yet, join in on the parade fun by decorating a commercial vehicle and entering it as a parade unit! Awards will be given to the business with the best parade unity entry.

The holiday parade brings thousands of spectators and participants to the City's commercial district and receives extensive local press coverage. The event will be taped and televised on the City's local access channel throughout the month of December. Coyotes

Generally, coyotes are reclusive animals that avoid human contact; attacks on people are extremely rare. Coyotes are generally nocturnal and typically do not come out in the day. While most are easily scared off when encountering humans, it is still important to be aware of hazing tips to keep coyotes wary of humans.

Note these hazing techniques:

- Basic hazing consists of standing your ground, never ignoring or turning your back to a coyote(s), yelling and making unpleasant and frightening noises until the animal(s) choose to leave.
- Aggressive hazing consists of approaching an animal quickly and aggressively throwing projectiles like rocks or tennis balls toward the animal, spraying with a hose, water gun containing water or white vinegar.
- Create fear of contact so the animal leaves the situation; use a whistle, horn, bell, bang pots/pans, stomp your feet.
- **NEVER RUN AWAY FROM A COYOTE.**

Safeguard your pets and property:

- Chaperone your pets when they are outside. Do not leave them outside overnight.
- Keep pets on a leash when outdoors.
- Do not feed coyotes or any other wildlife.
- Keep pet food inside.
- Provide secure enclosures for rabbits, chickens, etc.
- Keep garbage in tightly closed containers that cannot be tipped over.
- Remove sources of water, especially in dry climates.
- Put away bird feeders at night to avoid attracting rodents and other coyote prey.
- Pick up fallen fruit and cover compost piles.
- Learn proper, effective hazing techniques.
- Ask your neighbors to follow these tips.

ALPR Cameras Now Installed

Through the collaboration of all four Peninsula cities, the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department and the Palos Verdes Estates Police Department, Automatic License Plate Recognition (ALPR) cameras have now been installed at several strategic locations on the Hill. In all, there are 45 ALPR cameras to be installed around the Peninsula with complete installation estimated by the end of the year.

What is an ALPR camera? These cameras capture license plates and immediately notify law enforcement if a plate has anything criminally related - arson offender, sex offender, warrants, stolen vehicle or plates. ALPR technology is also a useful investigation tool and can help detectives identify and arrest suspects. Studies indicate that as arrest rates increase, crime decreases.

Your Peninsula cities, partnering with law enforcement, are working hard to combat crime. Please remember you can play a role, too . . . know your neighbors, be aware of the normal neighborhood activities so you can sense when something or someone looks out of place. Lock your doors and vehicles and do not leave valuables inside your car. Start or join a Neighborhood Watch group. Whether at home, or out and about on business or pleasure, be aware of your surroundings. **If something doesn't look right, report it immediately to the Lomita Sheriff's Station at (310) 539-1661. For emergencies, call 911. See Something, Say Something.**

Fire Safety During A Power Outage

Do you have everything needed in the event of a major power failure emergency?

Items to consider:

- Flashlight with spare batteries
- Alternative lighting (non-flammable)
- Food and water for at least 72 hours
- Alternative outside cooking appliance
- Battery-powered radio
- First aid kit and handbook
- Personal medical supplies
- Gasoline powered generator for any medical equipment needs
- Spare fuel
- Fire extinguisher, ABC multipurpose type
- Non-electrical can opener



The County of Los Angeles Fire Department would like to remind you that open flamed light sources, such as candles or tiki torches, are not recommended as alternative lighting. In addition, outside barbecues are not to be used inside as an alternative cooking source. Candles and other open flame devices left unattended or left lit overnight are one of the leading causes of home fires.

The Park and Activities Commission serves in an advisory role to the City Council in matters pertinent to the City's extensive system of parks, trails, and open spaces. The Park and Activities Commission also helps organize the annual City Celebration, The Hills Are Alive 10K/5K Run-5K Walk, the Tracy Austin Doubles Tennis Tournament, and serves as the Board of Directors for the Pepper Tree Foundation.

ENVIRONMENTAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE
